<p>How is the EU membership perceived among Hungarians beyond the “stay or leave” dilemma? What are the areas where Hungarians perceive the EU to have too much power, and what are the areas where they demand further integration? How do people perceive democracy, the rule of law, or corruption at different levels of society? We sought to answer these and similar questions throughout</p>	

our presentation on results which was then followed by a discussion with Zsuzsanna Szelényi, head of the Leadership Academy of the Democracy Institute at Central European University.

Following the presentation and the discussion with Zsuzsanna our participants engaged in a very vivid discussion confronting different ideas and opinions, exceeding our time booked at the venue. Many of them asked for more results of our research.

The event’s discussion was based on the results of the second wave of citizens’ consultations in Hungary, taking place throughout April 2023. The citizens consultations, on the topics of rule of law and covid-19, took place in the form of semi-structured, in-person, one-on-one interviews with 400 participants, with an added 600 online surveys to ensure representative results of the consultations.
